

Minutes 24 March 2009
Special Meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners
Held at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioner's Meeting Room
Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, North Carolina

Present for the Board of Commissioners meeting were Chairman Walter Savage, Commissioner Jerri Storie, and Commissioner Johnny Riddle. Also present at the meeting were County Manager Nathan Bennett, County Planner Jamie McMahan, Clerk to the Board Jason Robinson, Jody Higgins, and members of the general public.

Chairman Savage called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to approve the agenda. The motion was made by Commissioner Storie and was seconded by Commissioner Riddle. (See attachment A)

The Board heard from County Manager Bennett in reference to surplus property that the county owns. The County Manager informed the Board that many of the vehicles that were identified as surplus have not been operational in many years. Bennett informed the Board that he had been working with the various county departments to identify this surplus property and he has developed a list of 15 vehicles that can be considered surplus(Attachment B). The County Manager told the Board that under North Carolina General Statute 160A Article 12 that the county could opt for three methods of disposing of the surplus property. Those three processes are: a sealed bid, an upset bid, and a public auction. Discussion of the benefits of these three processes followed. The County Manager recommended to the Board that a sealed bid process be used and that he would advertise the property in the Common Times Journal as required by law. Having heard this Chairman Savage entertained a motion to declare the items listed as surplus property and to authorize the County Manager to dispose of same by method prescribed in NC General Statutes for disposition of surplus property. The motion was made by Commissioner Storie and was seconded by Commissioner Riddle.



Chairman Savage informed the Board that the principal of the Early College High School was not able to attend the meeting and made a motion that the item be tabled. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Riddle and the vote was unanimous.




Having no further business Chairman Savage entertained a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was made by Commissioner Riddle and was seconded by Commissioner Storie.



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

Please be advised that I have completed a preliminary assessment of county owned vehicles that are no longer in service and are parked around the County Courthouse and East Yancey Recycling Center. I had great cooperation from the Sheriff and other departments in determining the status and need for a number of vehicles. Upon inspection of these vehicles, it is obvious that the County has no need for these vehicles and in most cases costs of repair far exceed their value.
