

**Minutes of the 4 January 2011
Regular Meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners
Held at 7:00 o'clock p.m. in the Yancey County Courtroom
Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, North Carolina**

Present at the 4 January 2011 meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners were Chairman Johnny Riddle, Commissioner Jill Austin, Commissioner Dale England, Commissioner Michele Presnell, Commissioner Marvin Holland, County Manager Nathan Bennett, Clerk to the Board Jason Robinson, County Attorney Donny Laws, Sheriff Gary Banks, Finance Director Lynne Hensley, Finance Officer Brandi Burleson, Jody Higgins, and members of the general public.

Call to Order and Approval of Agenda

Chairman Riddle called the meeting to order, welcomed everyone and asked for a motion to approve the agenda with the addition of items about 4-H and Toe River Campground. Commissioner England made a motion to approve the agenda and it was seconded by Commissioner Presnell. The vote to approve was unanimous. (Attachment A)

Public Comment

The first person to speak before the Board was Bill Grover. He spoke about the American way and how it is becoming illegal because of the American Bar Association. He also talked about the education system and how it is being corrupted by Harvard and Yale. The next person to speak before the Board was Anthony Robinson who talked about religious freedom and about socialists being everywhere and causing decay in our society. The next person to speak before the Board was Betty Parker. Mrs. Parker talked about the need to have Marvin Holland on the Economic Development Commission (EDC). She asked why that Dale England couldn't move from his seat as a commissioner on the EDC to the Real Estate seat on the EDC. She thinks this would be good to help bring jobs to Yancey County. The next person to speak before the Board was Benny Riddle spoke about environmentalists and the problems they have caused with the economy. He talked about a logging proposal in the Mills River area on the Buncombe/Henderson County line that would provide jobs and money for schools and other industries in Western North Carolina counties. The final person to speak before the Board was Peter Franklin. He spoke about being in favor of hunting on Sunday and allowing people that go to church on Saturday to have a day to hunt.

Update on Toe River Campground and 4-H

Chairman Riddle next read a synopsis of the special meeting on December 30, 2010 with the Parks and Recreation Department concerning Toe River Campground. Chairman Riddle stated that the commissioners voted in favor of the County continuing to run Toe River Campground and the Board unanimously voted for Randy Hall to be the campground manager. The Board also voted to have the sewer system repaired. Chairman Riddle also said that a meeting was going to be held with the seasonal campers on January 20th at 6:00 pm. Chairman Riddle also commended the work done by the Cooperative Extension Service and read a letter from foster parents whose foster children were in the 4-H afterschool program at Bee Log. They expressed their thanks to the Board for funding the afterschool programs.

Update on Locust Creek Road

County Manager Nathan Bennett informed the Board that he had a response from the National Forest Service. Chairman Riddle then asked the Clerk to the Board to read the letter that was sent to the county manager (Attachment B). Commissioner Presnell stated that she was not going to give up on getting the gate open. Locust Creek is not accessible except for Locust Creek Road. She stated that she is going to keep working on the issue and asked if a response was sent from Congressman Shuler's office. County Manager Bennett stated that "no" a response has not been received.

Hunting on Sunday---Rev. Rick Woody

The Board next heard from Reverend Rick Woody about the NC Wildlife regulations that allow bow hunting on Sunday on private land. Reverend Woody wanted the Board to ask the General Assembly to restrict hunting on Sunday. He stated that he had come before the Board in August to ask for a resolution and he thought at that time that the Board was supportive of the proposal. He stated that he had two reasons to ask for this: First, he doesn't think it is needed because hunting has never been allowed on Sunday and many people observe it as the Sabbath Day, Second, he doesn't believe that the wildlife population can support it. Mrs. Mary Sapp also

spoke before the Board to ask for hunting to be restricted on Sunday because of it presents a safety issue for people who enjoy hiking and walking after church on Sunday. Discussion followed the presentation by Mr. Woody. Chairman Riddle stated that he thought a public hearing on this issue would be in order but Mr. Woody stated that he was finished with this issue after tonight one way or the other. More discussion followed about this issue, of which included a comment from Commissioner Presnell that Watauga had put this issue as a referendum and that hunting on Sunday could have impacts on insurance rates. After the discussion Commissioner England made a motion to table the issue to gather more information about the issue. The motion was seconded by Chairman Riddle. The vote to approve was unanimous among those members voting with Commissioner Holland abstaining from voting.

Finance Office Report

The Board next heard from Finance Director Lynne Hensley and Finance Officer Brandi Burleson. Mrs. Hensley and Mrs. Burleson were coming before the Board to get approval of Budget Amendments 4, 5, and 6 (Attachment C) to do the renovation that is necessary at the former Yancey Medical Center to convert it to office space for the Department of Social Service. Mrs. Hensley informed the Board that this would be done over three fiscal years in order to cut down on the impact to any one budget. Upon hearing from Mrs. Hensley and Mrs. Burleson, Commissioner Austin made a motion to approve the budget amendments. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Holland and the vote to approve was unanimous.

Resolution-Ratifying OMC Conveyance

The Board next heard from County Attorney Donny Laws. Mr. Laws stated that he came before the Board in order for the Board to ratify that the sale of the OMC property was done. Mr. Laws stated that he had looked and could find no official minutes in the commissioner's minute book for over two years. One of the pieces of business that we do know transpired during that time was the conveyance of the former OMC property to Tritico Investments, LLC. The reason that we know this piece of business transpired is because the deed for that property was filed in the Register of Deeds and was signed by the former county manager in 2007 but there were no minutes to reflect the conveyance. Mr. Laws stated that there needs to be a resolution to ratify that piece of business was conducted (Attachment D). Upon hearing from Mr. Laws Commissioner England made a motion to approve the resolution and it was seconded by Commissioner Holland. The vote to approve was unanimous. County Attorney Laws also advised the Board that they should empower the county manager and clerk to the board to contact the North Carolina School of Government about possible remedies to the missing minutes. Upon hearing from Mr. Laws Commissioner England made a motion to direct the county manager and clerk to the board to contact the School of Government and try to find a solution for the missing minutes. The motion was seconded by Chairman Riddle and the vote to approve was unanimous.

Resolution-Adopting a Policy for Mutual Assistance with other Law Enforcement Agencies

The Board next heard from Sheriff Gary Banks about adopting a policy for mutual assistance with other law enforcement agencies. According to Sheriff Banks this policy allows Yancey County to call in other law enforcement agencies in the event of a large scale emergency and allows Yancey County to assist other agencies in other counties if they ask for it. Sheriff Banks also informed the Board that this only needs to be done once in his four year term. Upon hearing from Sheriff Banks Commissioner Austin made a motion to approve the policy. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Holland and the vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment E).

Board Appointments

Chairman Riddle then read a letter from Yancey County Economic Commission Executive Director Wanda Proffitt about the resignation of Teresa Bryant from her seat on the Yancey County EDC who was appointed by the Board in 2010 for a three year term. According to the letter (Attachment F) Ms. Proffitt states that according to the EDC bylaws the appointment must be a realtor and would complete the remainder of the term of Mrs. Bryant. Upon hearing from Chairman Riddle Commissioner Presnell made a motion to appoint Commissioner England to this vacant seat and to then appoint Commissioner Holland as the county commissioner appointment. Commissioner Holland stated that he thought that this would be good for the county because the county contributes the lion's share of budget for the EDC, and that the commissioners should be able to work with the EDC Board to get two representatives of the county commissioners on that board. Commissioner Holland also seconded the motion made by Commissioner Presnell. Commissioner Holland also stated his experience once again and

qualifications to be on the EDC Board. Chairman Riddle then stated that he had talked to a few of the EDC members and they stated that they didn't want Commissioner Holland on the EDC Board. Commissioner Holland then stated that he had talked to several members of the EDC Board as well specifically the banking representative who stated that he would be happy to have Commissioner Holland on the EDC Board. Commissioner England stated that it was his understanding that he would have to resign from his current position on the EDC Board and he was not willing to do that. He then nominated Mrs. Jerri Storie to the position on the EDC Board to fulfill the term of Ms. Teresa Bryant until 2013. The nomination was seconded by Commissioner Austin. Chairman Riddle then called for a vote on the nominations. Commissioners Holland and Presnell voted for Commissioner Holland. Chairman Riddle along with Commissioners England and Austin voted for Mrs. Jerri Storie.

Pending Litigation Update-Frank and Franklin v. Yancey County

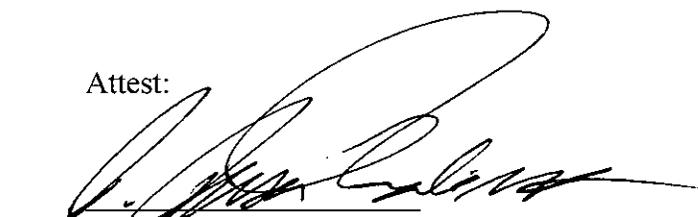

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Austin and the vote to go into closed session was unanimous. Upon coming out of closed session Commissioner Presnell made a motion to authorize the county attorney to contact Frank and Franklin's attorney to further settlement talks. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Austin and the vote to authorize was unanimous.

Adjournment

Having no further business Commissioner England made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Commissioner Austin. The vote to adjourn was unanimous.

Dear Mr. Bennett,

This is in response to your December 9, 2010, letter regarding the closure of Locust Creek Road, Forest Service Road 239, in the Hamrick Community of Yancey County, North Carolina.

In 1997 the Forest Service was preparing a timber sale (Sprout) that utilized Locust Creek Road to access several units located on the Appalachian Ranger District, Pisgah National Forest. The sale was appealed by the Southern Environmental Law Center who represented 125 individuals and/or families in the South Toe River Valley. The basis for their appeal was the Forest Service not having legal access across the private section of Locust Creek Road extending from North Carolina (NC) State Road 80 to National Forest System (NFS) lands.

We extensively researched this claim and found that when the Forest Service acquired the tract of land in 1921 (USA Tract M-116), legal access across Locust Creek Road was not included in the title to the property. In the ensuing years, we worked with private landowners along the road to acquire access rights by direct purchase. The Forest Service however, could not achieve the required consensus from the landowners to move forward with the purchase. In addition, we tried to acquire a tract of land that would give us access but the landowner could not provide a clear title to the property.

Since we were unable to acquire legal access, we could no longer leave Locust Creek Road open for public use because it would encourage members of the public to trespass on private land. In addition, we continue to receive complaints from adjacent landowners regarding hunters and hikers trespassing on private land. As the open section of the road is located completely on private lands, the landowners would have to work with the Yancey County Sheriff's office as we do not have the ability to enforce state laws on private land.

WHEREAS in order to make a public record of the above-referenced sale of Property the Yancey County Board of County Commissioners do hereby RESOLVE as follows:

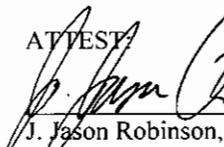

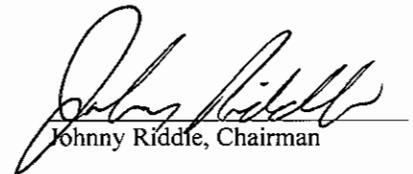

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A POLICY FOR MUTUAL ASSISTANCE WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes 160A-288, the governing body of a county may adopt appropriate guidelines for the purpose of mutual assistance with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said laws, the law enforcement assistance to be rendered authorizes lending officers to work temporarily with officers of the requesting agencies, including in an undercover capacity, and lending equipment and supplies; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the citizens of Yancey County to adopt a reasonable policy and guidelines whereby reciprocal law enforcement assistance can be both rendered to and obtained from other governmental jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, such reciprocal assistance is necessary for effective law enforcement for the protection of the citizens of Yancey County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE YANCEY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT:

1. The Sheriff is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance arrangements with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies, provided that the head of the requesting law enforcement agency makes such a request in writing.
2. The Sheriff is hereby authorized to permit officers of the Yancey Sheriff's Office to work temporarily with officers of the requesting agency, including in an undercover capacity, and the Sheriff may lend such equipment and supplies to requesting agencies as he deems advisable.
3. All such request and authorizations shall be accordance with North Carolina General Statutes 160A-288, as applicable.
4. While working with a requesting agency, an officer shall have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges and immunities (including those relating to the defense of civil actions and payment of judgments) as the officers of the requesting agency in addition to those the officer normally possesses.
5. While on duty with the requesting agency, an officer shall be subject to the lawful operational commands of the officer's superior officers in the requesting agency, but the officer shall for personnel and administrative purposes, remain under the control of the officer's own agency, including for purposes of pay. An officer shall furthermore be entitled to worker's compensation and the same benefits to the extent as though he were functioning within the normal scope of the officer's duties.

6. The Sheriff is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance agreements with other law enforcement agencies in accordance with such reasonable arrangements, terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the respective heads of the law enforcement agencies.

Commissioner Jill Austin moved for the adoption of the foregoing resolution.

Commissioner Marvin Holland seconded the motion and, upon vote, the same was adopted.
