

**Minutes of the 8 September 2014**  
**Regular Meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners**  
**Held at 6:00 o'clock p.m. in the Yancey County Courtroom**  
**Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, North Carolina**

Present at the 8 September 2014 meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners were, Chairman Johnny Riddle, Commissioner Jill Austin, Commissioner Jim Edwards, Commissioner Randy Ollis, Commissioner Jeff Whitson, County Manager Nathan Bennett, Clerk to the Board Jason Robinson, County Attorney Donny Laws, members of the media, and members of the general public.

**Call to Order and Approval of Agenda**

Chairman Riddle called the meeting to order. Chairman Riddle then asked Cooperative Extension Director Tres Magner to deliver the invocation. After the invocation Commissioner Edwards led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Riddle then asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Commissioner Edwards made a motion to approve the agenda and it was seconded by Commissioner Austin. The vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment A).

**Public Comment**

There was no public comment for the month of September.

**4-H Youth and Volunteer Awards**

The Board next heard from Mrs. Linda Semon with Yancey County 4-H. Mrs. Semon recognized all the winners of competition at the District and State Levels of competition (Attachment B). Mrs. Semon also recognized all of the youth and adult volunteers who have donated a total of 2,716 hours of service to Yancey County 4-H (Attachment C). These volunteers along with the winners were congratulated by the Board for their outstanding work and dedication to Yancey County 4-H.

**Friends Across North Carolina-Summer Funshine Camp**

The Board next heard from Mrs. Lucy Wilson with Friends Across North Carolina, who sponsor Camp Funshine each year at the Toe River Campground. According to Mrs. Wilson, this is the 15<sup>th</sup> year from Camp Funshine and this year there was about 300 campers who attended free of charge. Mrs. Wilson thanked the Board for their continued support and invited both the Board and staff to Camp Funshine next year, which is already being planned.

**Consent Agenda**

The Board next moved to the consent agenda portion of the agenda. On the consent agenda for September was the approval of the August 8<sup>th</sup> regular meeting minutes. Also included in the consent agenda was a request by the tax department for a tax refund for a taxpayer who had been paying taxes on property that he no longer owned (Attachment C). Finally, on the consent agenda was the August tax collection report (Attachment D). Upon hearing the items on the consent agenda, Commissioner Whitson made a motion to approve the consent agenda and it was seconded by Commissioner Ollis. The vote to approve was unanimous.

**County Manager Business**

The Board next heard from County Manager Nathan Bennett. Mr. Bennett informed the Board that every two years going into the state budget biennium, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) asks counties to submit legislative goals that they would like to see placed on the legislative agenda for the NCACC to advocate. This year the regional library system has brought a request for the Yancey County Commissioners to advocate a goal of restoring state funding to the aid to public libraries fund and to abide by the equitable formula developed by the State Library Commission. According to Mr. Bennett, since 2010-11 there has been \$207,000 that used to be received by the library system that has not been received. These funds are used to purchase books and software and can't be made up by local funds alone. Also according to Mr. Bennett, the General Assembly has been directing the Department of Cultural Resources to go outside of the equitable formula to fund libraries. Yancey County Library Chairperson, Jody Higgins thanked the Board for their support and the extra funds this year to give the librarians a raise. Chairman Riddle asked the Clerk to the Board to read the resolution concerning the NCACC goal (Attachment E). Upon the reading of the resolution, Commissioner Ollis made a motion to approve the resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Edwards and the vote to approve was unanimous. Mr. Bennett next moved to a resolution to

formally grant enforcement authority to the Yancey County Sheriff for dangerous dogs and protection of humans and other animals as delegated by state law. According to Mr. Bennett, since 2009 the county has had an animal control program through the Yancey County Sheriff's Department authorized mainly with state laws. This resolution gives the Sheriff or his designee the statutory authority to declare a dog as a "dangerous dog." According to Mr. Bennett, the Board has the authority to designate an official or an office to carry out this function. Mr. Bennett further stated that a dangerous dog board has been established, in 2009, to hear any appeals that may be brought concerning a dog being declared a "dangerous dog." Chairman Riddle asked the Clerk to the Board to read the resolution concerning the enforcement authority (Attachment F). Upon the reading of the resolution, Chairman Riddle made a motion to approve the resolution as read. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Whitson and the vote to approve was unanimous.

**County Attorney Business**

County Attorney Donny Laws stated that he had nothing for the Board at this time.

**Commissioner Business**

Commissioner Ollis stated that the Yancey County Social Services Board of Directors is whole once more with the state appointment of Peter Franklin. Commissioner Ollis also spoke about the NCACC Conference in mid-August in Asheville and the focus of incoming president Ronnie Beale of Macon County. According to Commissioner Ollis, Mr. Beale's focus for this year is going to be on the mental health problems that are currently plaguing the state. Commissioner Ollis expressed support for this initiative and thought that it was very much needed. Chairman Riddle stated that as of now TRACTOR has about \$100,000 in sales, which is a huge milestone considering last year they had about \$35,000 in sales. Chairman Riddle stated his hope that TRACTOR will continue the growth into the future.

**Adjournment**


Having no further business Commissioner Austin made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Commissioner Whitson. The vote to adjourn was unanimous.



N.C.G.S 105-381 Taxpayers remedies:

It has been brought to my attention, by Mr. Ernest Reynolds, that the tax office has been taxing the same structure on two separate parcels since 2007. Mr. Reynolds recently sold his property to his son and in researching the taxes; Robert Phillips office discovered this double taxation.

I have done the research and have come to the same conclusion as Robert Phillips office. In 2007 when the father deeded the home and 8.280 acres the original parcel was split the home was transferred to the sons acreage, however the home was never taken off the fathers property, which has resulted in both taxpayers paying taxes on the same structure since 2007. N.C.G.S. 105-287(3) (Taxpayer remedies)

***(3) If a tax has been paid, the taxpayer, at any time within five years after said tax first became due or within six months from the date of payment of such tax, whichever is the later date, may make a demand for a refund of the tax paid by submitting to the governing body of the taxing unit a written statement of his defense and a request for refund thereof.***

Attached is the request from Earnest Reynolds requesting such a refund?

2011 = \$ 183.85  
2012 = \$ 183.85  
2013 = \$ 202.24  
**TOTAL= \$753.79**

We caught this before the 2014 billing was done, and made the correction prior to the bills going out. The refund request is 2010-2013.

#### **A LEGISLATIVE GOAL OF THE NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO RESTORE STATE FUNDING TO THE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES FUND AND ABIDE BY THE EQUITABLE FORMULA DEVELOPED BY THE STATE LIBRARY COMMISSION**

**WHEREAS**, Yancey County is an active member in good standing of the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC); and

**WHEREAS**, every two years the membership of the NCACC develops and approves a package of legislative proposals designed to protect and enhance the interests of county governments and the citizens who live in our 100 counties; and

**WHEREAS**, support for public libraries is a matter of State of North Carolina public policy as described in N.C.G.S. §125-7; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina has cut funding for public libraries by nearly 26% over the past six years, which has cost each county with a loss of books, technology and other resources and services that are not possible to support with local funding alone; and

**WHEREAS**, public libraries are critical contributors to local workforce development by providing access to computers, job search assistance, small business support, and assistance to achieve educational goals; and

**WHEREAS**, public libraries provide free early literacy programs and materials to ensure that all children can attain the skills needed for success in the formal classroom; and

**WHEREAS**, the State Aid to Public Libraries Fund supplements, but does not replace, local funding and is distributed to the 80 library systems by population and per capita income based formula developed by the State Library Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, State Aid to Public Libraries Fund is a critical component of each library's operating budget, especially for regional library systems that serve multi-county areas; and


**WHEREAS**, public libraries are integral to our communities as centers of lifelong learning accessible to all citizens.



## RESOLUTION

### TO PROVIDE ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY FOR DANGEROUS DOGS AND PROTECTION OF HUMANS AND OTHER ANIMALS AS DELEGATED BY STATE LAW

**WHEREAS**, Yancey County provides animal control enforcement activities consistent with the laws and regulations of the State of North Carolina, through and by the Yancey County Office of the Sheriff since 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, N.C.G.S. 67, Article 1A pertains to Dangerous Dogs and requires that a person or a Board be designated by the County to determine when a dog is a "potentially dangerous dog"; and

**WHEREAS**, the Yancey County Board of Commissioners designated in 2009 that dangerous dog, dog warden, and all other animal control related statutes shall be enforced by an animal control officer and in 2010 the Sheriff of Yancey County was given the authority of the County animal control department and the authority vested therein; and

**WHEREAS**, the Yancey County Board of Commissioners has heretofore budgeted funds through the Yancey County Budget Ordinance to the Sheriff of Yancey County to perform enforcement of these applicable state statutes; and


**WHEREAS**, the Sheriff of Yancey County has heretofore accepted the responsibility for activities of animal control and related dangerous dog statutes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Yancey County Board of County Commissioners as follows:



2. That this resolution ratifies and affirms all previous actions pertaining to the designation of dangerous dogs by the Sheriff or his Designee in the enforcement of all provisions of N.C.G.S. 67.
3. That the Sheriff of Yancey County or his designee is hereby authorized to execute the powers and duties pertaining to animal control and enforce all applicable laws that are or may be established by North Carolina law.
