

Minutes of the 13 April 2015
Regular Meeting of the Yancey County Board of Commissioners
Held at 6:00 o'clock p.m. in the Yancey County Courtroom
Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, North Carolina

Present at the 13 April 2015 meeting of the Yancey County Board of County Commissioners were Chairman Johnny Riddle, Commissioner Jill Austin, Commissioner Byrl Ballew, Commissioner Randy Ollis, Commissioner Jeff Whitson, County Manager Nathan Bennett, Clerk to the Board Jason Robinson, County Attorney Donny Laws, County Planner Jamie McMahan, members of the press, and members of the general public.

Call to Order and Approval of Agenda

Chairman Riddle called the meeting to order. Chairman Riddle then asked Jim Edwards to deliver the invocation. After the invocation, Chairman Riddle led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Riddle then asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Commissioner Ollis made a motion to approve the agenda with the movement of item IV to the end of the meeting to allow for Dr. Cort's family to get to the meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Whitson. The vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment A).

SPECIAL RECOGNITION-Mount Mitchell State Park

County Manager Nathan Bennett then informed the Board that 2015 marks the 100th anniversary of Mount Mitchell State Park as the first state park in North Carolina. Upon hearing from Mr. Bennett, Chairman Riddle asked the Clerk to the Board to read the proclamation presented to the Board to declare 2015-16 "The Year of Mount Mitchell." Upon conclusion of the reading of the proclamation, Chairman Riddle encouraged all citizens and visitors to visit Mount Mitchell during this year. Commissioner Whitson then made a motion to approve the proclamation and it was seconded by Commissioner Austin. The vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment B).

Watauga, Avery, Mitchell, Yancey (WAMY) Community Action

The Board next heard from Melissa Soto, Executive Director of WAMY Community Action. Ms. Soto stated that 2015 marked the 50th anniversary of the WAMY program and was coming before the Board to ask for a resolution to be passed recognizing this anniversary and the work that WAMY has done over the years. Ms. Soto also reviewed with the Board what WAMY is doing now in Yancey County. Upon hearing from Ms. Soto, Commissioner Ballew made a motion to approve the resolution recognizing WAMY. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ollis and the vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment C).

Public Comment

There was no one who wished to speak at public comment before the Board.

Consent Agenda

The Board next moved to the consent agenda portion of the agenda. On the consent agenda for April were the approval of the March 9th regular meeting minutes and the March 16th special meeting minutes. Also included in the consent agenda was the March tax collection report (Attachment D). Upon hearing the items on the consent agenda, Commissioner Whitson made a motion to approve the consent agenda and it was seconded by Commissioner Austin. The vote to approve was unanimous.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION-Register of Deeds Willoree Jobe

The Board next moved to a special recognition of Register of Deeds Willoree Jobe. Mrs. Jobe was recognized for her 30 years of service to the citizens of Yancey County. Chairman Riddle read the resolution presented to Mrs. Jobe from the Board. Upon reading of the resolution, Commissioner Ollis made a motion to approve the resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Austin and the vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment E). Mrs. Jobe was also presented with the Order of the Longleaf Pine. Mrs. Jobe also received well wishes from former Governor Jim Hunt and Attorney General Roy Cooper.

Office of the Register of Deeds of Yancey County

The Board next heard from County Manager Nathan Bennett. Mr. Bennett reviewed the statutory process set forth to fill the vacancy created in the office of the Yancey County Register of Deeds. Mr. Bennett informed the Board that since the Register of Deeds is elected as a

partisan office that the Board was bound to the recommendation of the party of the retiring Register of Deeds. Mr. Bennett stated that the Yancey County Democratic Party had recommended Mrs. Susan Jobe to fill the unexpired term of Mrs. Willoree Jobe. Upon hearing from County Manager Bennett, Chairman Riddle made a motion to elect Susan Jobe to fill the unexpired term of the Mrs. Willoree Jobe as Yancey County Register of Deeds. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ollis and the vote to approve was unanimous (Attachment F). Mr. Bennett also informed the Board that Mrs. Susan Jobe currently has a bond that meets the statutory requirement of the Register of Deeds bond and that they would need to approve that bond for Mrs. Jobe. Upon hearing from County Manager Bennett, Commissioner Austin made a motion to approve the bond for Mrs. Susan Jobe as Register of Deeds and it was seconded by Commissioner Whitson. The vote to approve was unanimous.


SPECIAL RECOGNITION—Dr. Carolyn Cort



Having no further business Commissioner Whitson made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Commissioner Ollis. The vote to adjourn was unanimous.







PROCLAMATION

THE CENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY OF MOUNT MITCHELL STATE PARK

WHEREAS, Mount Mitchell is located in Yancey County, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Mount Mitchell, standing at an elevation of 6,684 feet above sea level, is the tallest point in eastern North America; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Assembly, through a bill introduced by Representative Gaston Pendley Deyton of Yancey County, enacted legislation on March 3, 1915 authorizing the purchase of land for a state park at Mount Mitchell and was signed into law by Governor Locke Craig to protect this treasure for the future enjoyment of all; and

WHEREAS, on March 31, 1915 Governor Craig appointed a commission to survey the boundaries of the new Mount Mitchell State Park consisting of the following individuals: Gaston Pendley Deyton of Green Mountain, Elbert Frank Watson of Burnsville, Murray Cornelius Arcemus Honeycutt of Burnsville, Wilson Hensley of Bald Creek, and Thomas Edgar Blackstock of Asheville who employed Yancey County Surveyor J.R. Young of Crabtree for the task; and

WHEREAS, in 1916, 795 acres were acquired on the summit of Mount Mitchell to create North Carolina's first state park forever protecting the scenic beauty and unique habitat of the high peak; and

WHEREAS, today Mount Mitchell State Park encompasses nearly 2,000 acres containing several other peaks which are in excess of 6,000 feet in elevation including Mount Craig, Big Tom and Balsam Cone; and

WHEREAS, in 2015-16, Mount Mitchell State Park will celebrate its Centennial Anniversary as the first state park in North Carolina.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Yancey County Board of County Commissioners that in commemoration of the centennial anniversary of the establishment of Mount Mitchell State Park on March 3, 1915 as the first North Carolina State Park that the year 2015-2016 be proclaimed as the *"Year of Mount Mitchell,"* and commend its observance to all citizens, and encourage all residents, schools, and one and all to visit Mount Mitchell, Yancey County, and the Town of Burnsville to participate in all celebrations and commemorative activities in recognition of 100 years of preserving Yancey County's greatest treasure.


WHEREAS, limited income citizens continue to need opportunities to improve their lives and their living conditions, thus ensuring that all citizens are able to live in dignity; and

WHEREAS, WAMY Community Action, Inc. is recognized as an important and integral part of the Yancey County community.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Yancey County Board of County Commissioners as follows:

3. That this resolution be effective upon its adoption.



WHEREAS, Willore Jobe is the longest serving Register of Deeds in the history of Yancey County; and


WHEREAS, Register of Deeds Willore Jobe retired from the Office of Register of Deeds of Yancey County on March 31, 2015.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Yancey County Board of County Commissioners as follows:


